
研究概況

走過十五載的《男女》^{*}

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一、《男女》緣起

1996年9月12-13日，荷蘭萊頓大學宋漢理(Harriet T. Zurndorfer)教授召集舉辦一次名為“New Directions in the Study of Chinese Women 1000-1800”的工作坊，邀請來自美國、歐洲及亞洲以人文及社會科學為研究專長的資深及新晉學者聚首一堂，發表多篇論文，最後經編輯整理，促成*Chinese Women in The Imperial Past: New Perspectives*一書的出版。¹是書的編者宋漢理教授認為必須有一個具有延續性的平台，讓專家學者繼續互相切磋和討論。²

1997年，宋漢理相約一批對性別研究有興趣的學者在萊頓相聚，商

議創辦一份涵蓋古今中國性別議題的跨學科國際學刊，當時得到著名出版機構博睿學術出版社(Brill Academic Publishers)的支持、落實，於是是由宋漢理為首的編輯委員會正式成立，創刊成員（以英文姓氏為序）尚有杜德橋(Glen Dudbridge)、管佩達(Beata Grant)、劉詠聰(Clara Wing-chung Ho)、梁其姿(Angela Ki-Che Leung)、曼素恩(Susan Mann)和羅溥洛(Paul S. Ropp)。刊名定為 *Nan Nü : Men, Women and Gender in Early and Imperial China*《男女：中國早期及帝制時期之男性、女性及性別》（以下簡稱《男女》），創刊號在 1999 年 3 月正式出版。

二、《男女》的內容

《男女》是一部以中國性別為主題，貫通歷代及近現代，而且是跨學科的國際學術期刊。每年出版二卷（分一、二期），每期發表三至四篇專論，第 1 卷至 14 卷共有學術論文 105 篇，字數最多的一篇長達 104 頁，蓋因《男女》不堅持字數的限制，讓作者可以暢所欲言。另外，研究綜論(review article)共有 9 篇，探討中國性別研究的趨勢。³ 此外，書評累積 125 篇，被評介專書達 127 本，其中英文專書有 71 本，中文專書 55 本（大陸佔 37 本，台灣 17 本及香港 1 本），日文專書 1 本。每卷第二期附有上一卷的校勘表(Corrigenda)，足見《男女》是編輯嚴謹的刊物。

在創刊之初，《男女》主要時限起自中國文明之始，迄 20 世紀初期。

因此刊名用上“Early and Imperial”的字眼。自2004年起，《男女》改名《男女：中國男性、女性及性別》(*Nan Nü: Men, Women, and Gender in China*)，將涵蓋的範圍伸展至整個20世紀，個別論文更牽涉現今社會的討論。筆者做了粗略的統計，《男女》所刊載的文章大致涉及的時段包括：上古至漢代3篇、漢代至隋代12篇、唐宋遼金夏元8篇、明清44篇及20世紀以降24篇（參附表一《男女》各期論文類別及數量統計）。其中以研究明清時期的性別問題佔最多數，其次為20世紀至今，反映學術界的研究焦點，及傳統性別題材在近現代社會的啟發性及延續性。由此觀之，《男女》確實達到貫通古今的目標。

此外，《男女》設有專號，在已出版的14卷中，已出版過5次專號，包括以「帝國晚期的女性自殺現象」(Female suicide in late imperial China)、「兩性與20世紀都市化問題」(Gender, Genre and Cosmopolitanism)、「女性與醫療」(Medicine for Women in Imperial China)、「明代的男性友誼」(Male Friendship in Ming Dynasty)和「性別與宗教」(Women, Gender and Chinese Religion)。每卷專號均由代表性學者撰寫「導論」(Introduction)⁴編訂主題及「書目」(Bibliography)，⁵比較特別的是每期專號均同時獨立以專書形式由同一出版社出版。⁶

編輯群的研究方向直接影響期刊風格。隨著曼素恩、羅博洛及梁其姿等舊成員的退出，編輯委員會同時間亦注入新血，魏愛蓮(Ellen Widmer)、李貞德(Jender Lee)、白亞仁(Allan Barr)、艾梅蘭(Maram Epstein)、李木蘭(Louise Edwards)、高彥頤(Dorothy Ko)等學者加入編輯委員會，顯示《男女》銳意吸納更多不同範疇的學者，豐富這一塊討論的園地。歷任編輯委員會成員來自歐洲、北美、中國及臺灣，皆是國際級漢學專家，治學範圍包括經濟、社會、宗教、科學、史學、文學、法律、軍事等多方面（參附表二：《男女》歷屆編輯委員會成員）。編委會成員學術背景多元化，直接促使《男女》編纂風格呈現出跨學科的視野。

三、《男女》對性別史研究的影響

翻開《男女》的首頁，「宗旨與目標」(Aims and Scope)已清楚明言：

“*NAN NÜ*, now also including twentieth century, is an interdisciplinary, international, peer-reviewed journal featuring original studies related to men, women, and gender in the fields of Chinese history, literature, linguistics and language, anthropology, archeology, art and music, law, philosophy, medicine/science, and religion. The journal discusses the subject to China today.”（「《男女》，包括 20 世紀中國的討論，是一部跨學科和具國際級評審的學術期刊，刊載具創見的中國兩性研究論著，範圍包括史學、文學、語言學、人類學、考古學、藝術、音樂、法律、哲學、醫學、科學及宗教等。《男女》亦兼論現今中國社會的兩性議題。」）

筆者對已發表的百多篇論文進行統計，發現其中所涉獵的學科以文學佔

最大比例(30%)，而史學、宗教、社會問題比率相若，其他性文化、醫學、藝術、哲學等亦佔一定程度的比例（參附表三：《男女》涉獵的學科分佈）。這反映出目前學風、作者群的興趣。

《男女》雖以性別為主題，但每篇論文並不限於一個範疇，同一篇論文或牽涉兩個或以上的學科範疇。每篇論文運用的史料包羅萬有，包括考古遺址、詩詞小說、音樂戲劇的曲譜、繪畫雕塑、報章雜誌、宗教經典、法律文件等等，從不同的文獻實物中尋找更多中國社會發展的線索。另一方面，《男女》雖是以中國性別為題材的英文學刊，但作者採用的資料，並不限於英文及中文，更有採用日本、韓文或歐洲各國語文的第一手及二手資料。再者，正如上文所說，《男女》不但評介英文書，也評介中、日文書。凡此均顯示《男女》對不同學科、不同材料、不同語文的兼容性。

《男女》無論在內容、資料等方面都為研究性別史學者提供極具參考價值的材料，學者因而廣泛地引用《男女》論文。根據近幾年出版有關性別史的論文集作一個統計，結果顯示，幾乎每一本論文集均有至少一、二篇文章引用《男女》發表之論文。例如鄧小南的《唐宋女性與社會》中有 1 篇；⁷《中國婦女史讀本》有 2 篇，其中一篇更是原載於《男女》；⁸ *Overt & Covert Treasures: Essays on the Sources for Chinese Women's History* 有 4 篇等等。⁹ 而近年由葉山(Robin D. S. Yates)所編的 *Women in China from*

Earliest Times to the Present: A Bibliography of Studies in Western Languages 亦將《男女》由第 1 卷至 10 卷的專題論文全數著錄。


《男女》作者群來自世界各地，有的已具有世界級知名度，有的是新晉學者。《男女》採匿名評審制，每篇論文均經兩名或以上評審員之評核，通過後方可刊登，並不受知名度、職級、工作單位、種族等因素所限制。《男女》作為一本國際性的學術期刊，確實提供一個園地，讓世界知名學者和後起之秀互相切磋，新晉學者亦能有一展所長的機會。而推動性別研究以美國學者貢獻稍多，《男女》的作者正好反映此一現象：來自美加的學者佔 70%，其中 37% 為美籍華裔學者。歐洲和亞洲學者各佔 15%（參圖一：《男女》作者國籍分佈）。由此可見，今日的性別研究，仍然以美加為主要發展地區，但研究隊伍之中，華裔學者是不可忽視之力量。

在知識全球電子化的時代，《男女》和不少學刊一樣，也同時出版紙本和電子版(<http://booksandjournals.brillonline.com/content/15685268>)。不少電子數據庫為讀者提供搜尋《男女》論文的功能，方便世界各地的讀者在所屬地區閱覽。根據WorldCat(<http://www.worldcat.org/>)全球圖書館搜查網絡的數據顯示，除紙本的收藏外，各國圖書館主要以電子期刊形式連結《男女》。雖然很難將各國圖書館所藏《男女》數量統計出一個實質的數字，但可參考一些指標地區，例如已加入WorldCat 的 103 間美國圖書館中，就提供了 400 多個途徑連結《男女》的電子期刊。明顯地，《男女》的流通量已不再限於紙本的銷售。¹⁰

在《男女》創刊的第二年，當時未曾加入編委會的李木蘭就作出這樣的評價：「毫無疑問，所有對中國性別研究有興趣的學者，均會歡迎這本優秀的新學刊」(There is no doubt that all scholars interested in gender in China will welcome the appearance of this excellent, new journal.)。¹¹《男女》昂然邁向第十五年，而且內容更豐富，它是中國性別研究領域中持續優秀的期刊。
